

With a regional population of 6M+, strategies to strengthen our sector's ability to meet the rising demands for services are crucial to alleviating poverty.





- The Houston MSA unemployment rate is 5.6%, well above the 4.2% national unemployment rate (approx. 168,216 unemployed people including more than 115,000 young adults (ages 16-24) neither working nor in school)
- 88% COVID-19 recovery rate (12% of people who lost their jobs in March 2020 are STILL unemployed)
- Poor families in Greater Houston have a food insecurity rate 4 percentage points higher than the national average. An estimated 1 in 8 people in Greater Houston are estimated to have been food insecurity in 2021 or 724,750 people including an estimated 300,000 children.
- As of January 23, 2022 there were 9,000 COVID-19 cases reported per week

Training and Networking

ACAM promotes best practice knowledge, peer learning, collaboration and information exchange. We offer training in five areas that are most critical to community assistance ministries.

Since June 2020, ACAM's Housing Stability programs have served 10,128 people (4,601 households) with \$6,396,114.

In partnership with Welnity, ACAM deployed an online screening tool to enhance targeted service referral for each individual level on the continuum.
