





HOW YOU HELPED CHILDREN

Blessed Beginnings program provided education and support to **3,601** mothers



103 inner-city students received mental health counseling -- more than 80% showed improved symptoms, behavior and academic achievement



HOW YOU HELPED FAMILIES




8,733 households received emergency rental or utility assistance






