You were a blessing to a family in need

Rosa was getting more and more nervous as her due date approached. At 35, she was pregnant for the first time and, while eager to welcome a child into the world, she didn't know how she would make ends meet while she couldn't work.

Thanks to your generosity, before giving birth, Rosa was able to attend parenting classes to prepare for the child's arrival and even was given a baby shower so she'd have the diapers, formula, and clothes her baby would need.

Rosa was working and making ends meet when she got pregnant. About eight months into her pregnancy, she began to think about the wages she would lose when she had to take off after she had her baby. She heard about Catholic Charities' Blessed Beginnings Life Center and decided to call.

Because of your generosity, Rosa's expectations were blown out of the water. Not only did she learn about how to be a good mother, but she also received diapers, wipes, and even food assistance from our food pantry – something she may not have had at all if she had not made that initial call to Catholic Charities.

Thanks to You, Marco Found a Job and Kept His Home

Your gift made a difference when Marco was at his lowest point

Marco lost his job last winter and, after being out of work for months, his confidence in his abilities plummeted. Inflation made his financial woes worse, and he knew that if something didn't happen soon, he would end up homeless.

Because of you, Marco received emergency financial assistance to stay housed, and help to fine-tune his resume and interviewing skills from Catholic Charities. He regained his confidence and had hope for the first time in months. Marco started a new job in the hospitality industry last month. You made this possible!

Marco had regular but unfulfilling work for years. But last winter, when he lost his job, the sudden change impacted more than Marco's financial situation. It also affected his overall mood and confidence level. In a matter of months, Marco went from regularly working to being at risk of homelessness, while he sank deeper into depression.

Thanks to your generosity, when Marco came to Catholic Charities in the spring, he was met by a case manager who not only helped him stay housed, but also worked with him to create a path to self-sufficiency. Marco received a resume critique, interview preparation and assistance with putting together a portfolio.

Because of you, Marco regained his confidence and decided that he would pursue a job aligned with his passion: cooking and baking. He started his new job in July and is eager to climb the ranks and regain his financial footing along the way.

You Helped an Aunt Raise Her Orphaned Nieces

Thanks to your gifts, Ann didn't have to worry about providing meals for the kids

After Ann's sister died, her two nieces were left with no parents, so Ann immediately opened her home to the two girls, despite only having a limited income.

Ann copes with physical disabilities that prevent her from working in a fulltime job, but she's able to earn some money doing alterations. Bianca is hurting, but for just \$27.93 you can provide her family with a week's worth of food, and take one worry off her mind.

Ann first came into contact with Catholic Charities in 2008 when Hurricane lke barreled through Galveston. Her small alterations business was destroyed at the time.

"Sometimes, it's really hard"

"Catholic Charities came to me and asked if I needed some help," she said. "They got me a new washing machine and a new refrigerator. It was really nice."

Many years later, Ann knew she could turn to the Beacon of Hope Center on Galveston Island for groceries to feed her nieces.

"Sometimes, it's really hard," said Ann. "They're growing kids, so they eat a lot. Food distributions have helped tremendously, really helped a lot."

Ann speaks from the heart when she says thank you to Catholic Charities and its supporters.

"It makes a big difference," she said. "It's been a life saver. If I ever won the lottery or anything, the first place I would give money to would be Catholic Charities. I see you doing more than anyone else."
