Deidre was tired. She fled with her son from an abusive relationship to a homeless shelter. Then, at the shelter, her roommate was angry and violent. She fled again.

Then – because of you – she found safety. Your generosity made it possible for Deidre, a veteran, to find a place in the Women Veterans Program. There, she found the support she needed and made a plan to turn her life around.

"I felt like a total failure," Deidre said.

"You helped me to have confidence in myself and set me on a straight path."

Deidre felt a great amount of guilt for the trauma she and her son were going through. More than anything, she wanted safety and security for her family. Because of you, Deidre was able to stay in a hotel while she sorted things out. You even provided food for Deidre and her son!

Your support gave Deidre the confidence to seek a job, and she soon found one. Recently, she and her son moved into their first house. You made all of this possible.

"I went from being homeless and jobless to building up my confidence," Deidre said. "I'm forever grateful."

"Feed the hungry, and help those in trouble."




You gave Tommy food - and joy
