Safe at Home Again You helped Eduardo escape from living on the streets to the security of a home

Eduardo lost his car, and the bad news kept on coming. Soon after, he lost his job and then his home. Eduardo did what he could to survive, sometimes bathing in the bayou to stay clean. It was a hard and lonely life. One of the most difficult things was that he no longer had a place where his family, especially his granddaughter, could come to visit.

Then, Eduardo found the food pantry and caring staff at Catholic Charities' Guadalupe Center. Because of you, a case manager in the Family Assistance Program was there to talk to Eduardo. When she learned he was homeless she was able to help him get the assistance he needed to get an apartment.

Because he now has a kitchen, Eduardo is able to make use of nutritious items from the food pantry that he couldn't previously take such as cold dairy, meat and produce. Your support enabled the Center to set him up with clothes, bedding, dishes and hygiene items. All donated by people like you! One of his greatest joys: taking home a donated Easter basket to give to his granddaughter.

The Guadalupe Center is seeing more people who were driven to the streets after suffering losses related to Hurricane Harvey. With your generous assistance, Catholic Charities' HomeSafe initiative can restore hope – and a home – to more people like Eduardo.

HomeSafe, Not Homeless Your compassion for our neighbors in need helps us prevent homelessness



By supporting the HomeSafe initiative, you provide compassionate care to those in need, helping them remain in their homes.

At the end of a long work day, most of us look forward to returning to the security and comfort of a home where we have food to eat and a warm bed for the night's sleep. Sadly, thousands in the greater Houston area lack that security because they are homeless. Many more are just one emergency away from joining them.

Homelessness is a preventable problem. Because of you, Catholic Charities' HomeSafe initiative offers caring, compassionate help to families, seniors and children through programs that address poverty from a variety of perspectives.

Many families in crisis only need a one-time intervention to stay in their homes and prevent the costly and traumatic experience of eviction, which may mean losing their belongings and incurring bad credit. Because of your support, Catholic Charities can provide short-term financial assistance when it's most needed to cover basic necessities - like rent, utilities or medicine - to help stabilize a family. Then, case managers work with them on strategies to avoid future budget disasters.

Your gifts also enable Catholic Charities to provide additional assistance through food pantries for families who must skimp on groceries to pay other nonflexible bills, like rent.

By supporting the HomeSafe initiative, you provide compassionate care to those in need, helping them remain in their homes, apply for and access public benefits, and connect to service programs.

Pope Francis said, "To live charitably means not looking out for our own interests, but carrying the burdens of the weakest and poorest among us."

With your help, together, we will continue to lift up those in danger of homelessness so they can be carried to safety by the HomeSafe Initiative.

Order of Malta Feeds Hungry Families in Fort Bend



Nearly 50 volunteers from the Order of Malta donate their time to make sure families in need in Fort Bend County receive nutritious food through the monthly food fairs at Mamie George Community Center.

On Saturday at the Mamie George Community Center, dozens of energetic volunteers sort through boxes of nutritious food to prepare for families in need. They are members of the Order of Malta, a 900-year-old Catholic lay-religious order that focuses on defending the faith and serving the sick and poor.

Each month, MGCC holds a food fair for low income families from Fort Bend County. The Order of Malta, about 60 Knights and Dames, first partnered with MGCC to support food fairs in 2011, and quickly discovered that they needed reinforcements as the population of clients grew. Catholic Charities recruited 40 to 50 additional volunteers, many of them enthusiastic high school students seeking opportunity to serve the community.

MGCC receives produce from the Houston Food Bank – nearly 20,000 pounds of fresh fruit and vegetables for families who come to the center for food assistance. Because the Order of Malta focuses on providing a balanced diet, they prefer to send families home with protein as well. The Food Bank supplies protein on a more sporadic basis, so the Order began providing funds to make it a more consistent part of the food fair. Just in 2017, the Order donated \$20,000 to MGCC for this purpose, in addition to donating funds for two construction projects.

Catholic Charities is grateful for the support of the Order of Malta and other volunteers who do God's work for the poor and the sick!
