She was worried about paying her bills and how she would take care of her kids without an income.

Myths and Facts About Families Living in Poverty



Many families were forced into poverty as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, but there are still many misconceptions about poverty.

Millions of Americans have struggled over the past year with the economic blow from the COVID-19 pandemic. Many families already struggling lost their jobs and are now straining to pay for basic needs such as rent and food. However, there are still many misconceptions about poverty.

MYTH: Low-income families do not work.

FACT: More than 10 million of those Americans living in poverty are "working poor;" they either have jobs or have been looking for work for at least half a year. In Texas, 80% of families who received SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits had at least one working adult, and two-thirds of people living in poverty work more than one job.

MYTH: If you're not officially poor, you aren't poor.

FACT: Even if a family earns above the federal poverty threshold, living on the edge of poverty can be just as stressful as living in poverty. A recent survey showed that 40% of Americans would struggle to afford a \$400 unexpected bill. Families who live paycheck to paycheck find it difficult to afford unexpected expenses, pay off debt or save money.

MYTH: Only homeless people live in poverty.

FACT: While families who live in poverty do sometimes struggle to maintain housing, they are not all homeless. However, they are more at risk of becoming homeless by experiencing a financial crisis – job loss, a pandemic, an unexpected medical emergency, etc. – due to low-income. Last year, the federal poverty line for a family of four was \$26,500.

Providing a Path to Home



Dear Friends,

One of the many lessons I've learned throughout the ongoing pandemic is what it means to have a home. Our homes are our sanctuaries – a safe haven, a place of comfort, and a space to build memories with our families.

For so many vulnerable families in our community, they are constantly faced with the threat of losing their place of shelter and

refuge. Many people were already one emergency away from crisis, and then the pandemic followed by Winter Storm Uri caused them to lose their jobs, and face hunger and homelessness.

Thanks to your generosity, Catholic Charities has helped keep families in their homes. Since July, we have provided more than \$1.2 million in emergency financial assistance to help with rent and utilities; over 4.7 million pounds of food distributed from our regional food pantries; and more than \$230,000 in direct assistance for people impacted by Winter Storm Uri.

And to help even more families impacted by the pandemic, Catholic Charities has collaborated with the City of Houston, Harris County, the Houston Housing Authority, the Coalition for the Homeless, and other organizations to help struggling families avoid evictions and stay in their homes.

While there seems to be hope on the horizon for an end to the pandemic, the economic hardships for those already on the edge of poverty will continue for a long time. With your faithful support, Catholic Charities will be here to meet whatever needs arise from this crisis to help our most vulnerable neighbors on the path to self-sufficiency.

You Gave People Like Joe a Home

Rapid Re-Housing Program helps people who face homelessness



Many people faced homelessness due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Thanks to your support, vulnerable people are able to find a home.

"I don't know if you have wings...but you came and grabbed me away from the streets."

Because you gave to Catholic Charities, families who would otherwise be living on the street are able to get a good night's rest in the security of their own home. Your gifts allow Catholic Charities to provide help through programs like Stable Homes, which promotes housing stability through rental assistance, education and resources that build a path to self-sufficiency.

During the pandemic, Catholic Charities recognized that many more vulnerable families needed help to maintain a home. More needed to be done, so with the support of donors like you, the Rapid Re-Housing Program was launched in the fall of 2020, when thousands of area residents were becoming homeless after losing jobs or wages due to COVID-19.

In collaboration with the Houston Housing Authority and the Coalition for the Homeless, the program rescues people who have recently fallen into homelessness, providing them with an apartment and connection to a full range of Catholic Charities programs to help them reclaim their self-sufficiency.

Because of you, we were able to help Joe, a single man in his 30s, who found himself living on the streets during the pandemic. Even though he was disabled he wanted to work, but he was unable to find a job that would accommodate his mobility. Because of you, Joe was able to get employment assistance from Catholic Charities, help with bus cards to get to work, and groceries from the Guadalupe Center Food Pantry.
