Texas has the second largest women veteran population **Women** are fastest growing segment of veterans More than **2X** likely to experience homelessness than non-veteran women



13-15% of women veterans living in poverty will experience homelessness.

Challenges

- MST (Military Sexual Trauma)
- PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder)
- Domestic violence
- Mental health issues

History

2012 Program begins; connections to housing and support services

2015 The Villa shelter opens at Guadalupe Center

2016 Expansion to Fort Bend and Galveston

2020 Comprehensive services in three counties to empower women veterans





Pathways to Hope

Pathways to Hope provides women veterans and their dependents short-term financial assistance, financial planning, case management, aftercare services, and other supportive services.

Eligibility

- Woman Veterans residing in Harris, Galveston, or Fort Bend Counties
- Experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness



Mental Health

Mental Health services are provided by licensed mental health professionals who have had training in evidence-based treatments designed for veterans and their families. Services are patient centered, effective, accessible, equitable, and efficient.
